

BYLAW NO. 2-1966

A BYLAW TO LICENSE AND REGULATE THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Pense No. 160 of the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows;

Definition of "HAMLETS" shall herein be deemed to mean the legal boundaries of Stony Beach and Keystown.

1. Every person who owns, possesses or harbours a dog (which term for the purpose of this Bylaw, be deemed to mean either a male or female over six months old) within the Hamlets shall obtain a license from the Secretary-treasurer. The fees per year shall be as follows:
Male-----\$5.00 per year each animal
Spayed female-----\$5.00 per year each animal
Female-----\$10.00 per year each animal
The sum payable for a license required after July 1st in any year shall be three-fifths of the charge for a full year.
2. All licenses issued under the provisions of this Bylaw will expire on December 31st next following date of issue.
3. Any person residing in the hamlets who owns, possesses or harbours a dog, and neglects or refuses to take out a license shall therefore be deemed guilty of an infraction of this Bylaw.
4. Every person to whom a license has been issued under this Bylaw shall cause his dog to wear a collar to which shall be attached the license tag issued by the Rural Municipality.
5. No dog shall be allowed to run at large in the Hamlets and for the purpose of this Bylaw, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when it is beyond the boundaries of the land occupied by the owner.
6. Any person who owns, possesses or harbours a dog found running at large shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this Bylaw.
7. Any dog found running at large contrary to the provisions of this Bylaw, whether licensed or not, may be killed by, or by the order of a Municipal constable or an appointed agent of the Municipality.
8. No vicious dog shall be allowed to run at large at any time, and such a dog may be killed by a Municipal constable or appointed agent of the Municipality.
9. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any provisions of this Bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Municipality.
